Notice and Demand

Greetings Officer,

I respectfully provide this notice to affirm my constitutionally secured rights:

1. **I am traveling privately in my own private conveyance for personal, non-commercial purposes.** I am **not driving** in commerce or operating a "motor vehicle" for hire under state-issued privilege.
2. **The United States Supreme Court** has clearly ruled that:
 - The **right to travel** is a **fundamental constitutional right** (*Crandall v. Nevada*, 1868; *Shapiro v. Thompson*, 1969).
 - The **government may not require licenses, permits, or fees for the exercise of a right** (*Murdock v. Pennsylvania*, 319 U.S. 105, 1943).
3. **I do not consent** to any unlawful stops, searches, seizures, or demands for license, registration, or insurance when exercising my private rights.
I am not engaged in any activity that requires such regulation under the commercial codes of the State.
4. **I fully retain all my rights at all times**, and nothing I say or do should be construed as a waiver of any rights, protections, or immunities under the U.S. Constitution or State Constitutions.
5. **I respectfully request** that you honor your Oath of Office to uphold the Constitution, and refrain from interfering with my right to peacefully travel.
